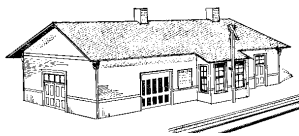

The purpose is to allow any mem-

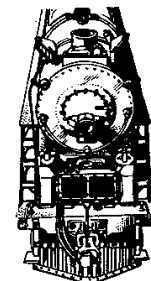
bers that wish to attend and to provide information on the club's activities to the newsletter editor in a timely manner for publication.
